EARTHDAY.ORG's theme for Earth Day 2021 is **Restore Our Earth**, which focuses on natural processes, emerging green technologies, and innovative thinking that can restore the world's ecosystems. Restoring Our Earth includes reforestation, regenerative agriculture, citizen science, and putting an end to plastic pollution, all starting with climate literacy. A major theme of this Earth Day also focuses on Climate and Environmental Literacy to ensure that students across the world benefit from high-quality education to develop into informed and engaged environmental stewards. The time is now — indeed it is long overdue — for a massive climate literacy campaign that can create a generation of citizens, workers and leaders who really understand why and how to stop climate change and environmental degradation.

Earth Day unites citizens on the importance of the fight for our health, livelihoods, and planet. If we don't demand change to transform our planet and environmental issues, our current state will become the new normal — a world where pandemics, polluted lands and waters, disappearing forests, and extreme weather events span Africa, leaving already marginalized and vulnerable communities even more at risk.

From now until Earth Day (April 22) we are calling on everyday citizens to rise up and come together to engage the public, educate people about the environment, and act to make positive and sustainable changes to protect Africa and the Earth. # Earth Day Video 2021 <u>Restore our Earth</u>

Participate in the Earth Day movement by lending your voice with a 1 - 2 minute video. Your videos will be featured on our social media platforms and we ask that you share them on your profiles as well.

What we need: Good video quality, shooting on your mobile phone or a professional camera would work. You must shoot the video horizontally, in good natural light, and in a quiet environment.

Videos that do not follow the instructions above will not be considered.



Record in english, french or arabic, however one can record the video in any preferred language to bring the diversity and unity towards our goal.

- 1. Introduce yourself: Hello, my name is (x) and I am from (x). I am a(n) (occupation and organization; or a youth activist, student, or volunteer.) 2. Why Participate in Earth Day live 2021? What or whom are you fighting for? It could be for your children, the rights of frontline communities, safe water to drink, clean air or green space, or something else.
- 3. How can we work together to Restore Our Earth? What are the most important actions that different members of society can take?
- 4. What else compels you to act? Why are you committed to this fight, now more than ever?
- 5. Finally, if you could sign off by saying: "Let's all commit to Restore Our Earth.

## Create or Join a Network

- Establish a central location for digital discussions on WhatsApp, Facebook, etc. to discuss Earth Day, environmental issues and to build a strong network of partners and volunteers.
- Share ideas, resources, and plans to mobilize people digitally for Earth Day.


# **Climate Literacy**
